OUR mission

St. Patrick Center provides opportunities for self-sufficiency and dignity to persons who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. Individuals achieve permanent, positive changes in their lives through affordable housing, sound mental health, employment and financial stability.

NEIGHBORHOOD SUPPORT PROGRAM A St. Patrick Center Housing Program

Although an individual or family may have income and/or a home, St. Patrick Center remains a resource for those who need assistance in times of crises. To help our neighbors in need, we initiated the Neighborhood Support Program.

Through this program, our counselors provide crisis-intervention on a case-by-case basis. Typically, St. Patrick Center supplies one-time payments to St. Louis City residents for situations such as reconnecting utilities or preventing impending evictions, defaults or foreclosures. The agency also provides emergency items like clothing, food and household goods. The Neighborhood Support Program provides for needs that programs do not address, and counselors can supply referrals to other community resources.

This program also contains a preventative aspect since it identifies people who may benefit from other St. Patrick Center programs.

In Fiscal Year 2011, 714 poverty-level individuals (484 families) in existing housing received utility or rent payment assistance to overcome housing crises.

Other St. Patrick Center Housing Programs: Independent Living Skills/ABE & GED/Fast Track GED; Project Protect; Rosati Apartments & Rosati Assertive Community Treatment (ACT); Rosati Group Home; Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF).

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
